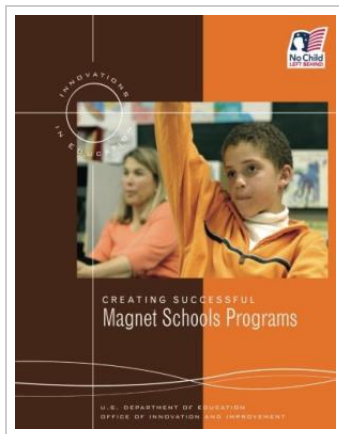




Creating Successful Magnet Schools Programs
