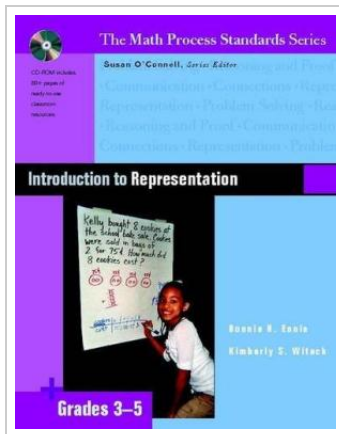




Introduction to Representation: Grades 3-5 (Paperback)
