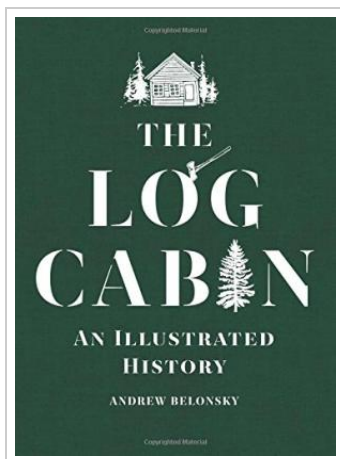




The Log Cabin: An Illustrated History
