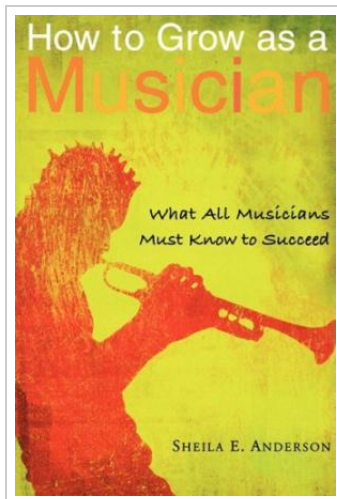




How to Grow as a Musician: What All Musicians Must Know to Succeed
