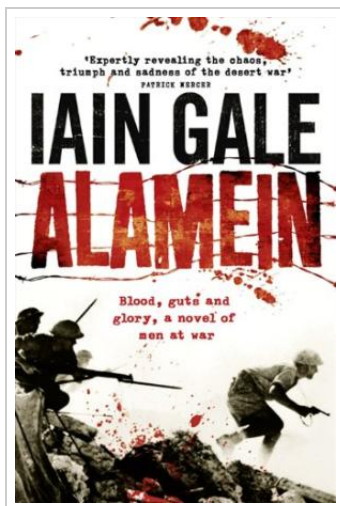




Alamein: The Turning Point of World War Two
