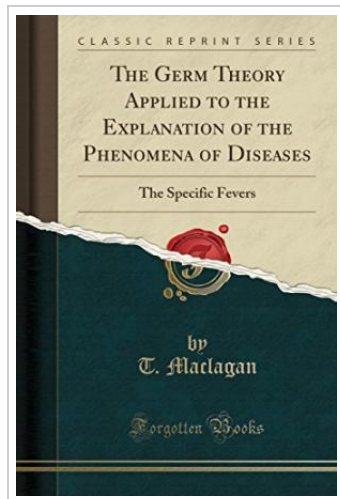

Bearing as The Germ Theory of Disease does, on the pathology of the most important ailments to which man is liable, the establishment, or the refutation of this theory, is a matter of importance not only to medical science, but to mankind. Hitherto, the question has been treated chiefly as a biological one. More attention has been paid to the mode of origin, than to the mode of action, of the germs which were supposed to exist. One object which I have in view is to rescue The Germ Theory of Disease from what I consider a false and misleading position, and to give to it its true and legitimate standing as a pathological question.
