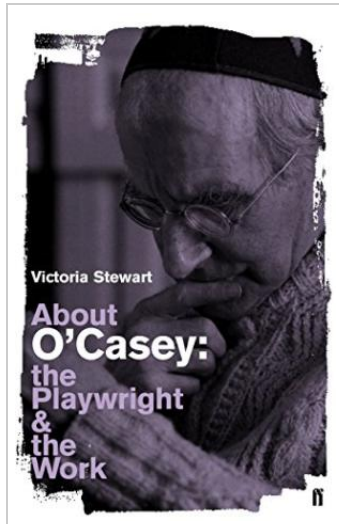




About O'Casey: The Playwright & the Work
