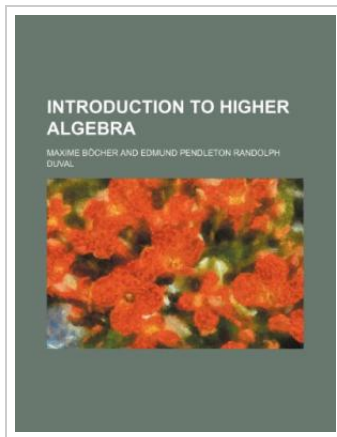

If it were indefinite, we could (Theorem 1) find two real points y, z , at one of which it is positive, at the other, negative. Hence (Theorem 2) we could find two real points linearly dependent on y and z , at which the quadratic form vanishes. Neither of these will be the point $(0, 0, . 0)$, since, by Theorem 2, they are linearly independent. Moreover, they are neither of them vertices. Thus we see that the form must be definite, and the sufficiency of the condition is established. It remains to be proved that a definite form can vanish only at its vertices and at the point $(0, 0, . 0)$. Suppose (4) is definite and that $(y_v. y_n)$ is any...
