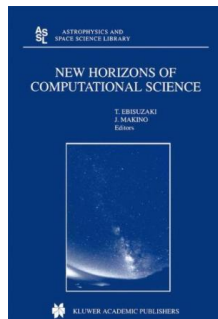

The International Symposium on Supercomputing - New Horizon of Computational Science was held on September 1-3, 1997 at the Science Museum in Tokyo, to celebrate 60-year birthday of Professor Daichiro Sugimoto, who has been leading the theoretical and numerical astrophysics for 30 years. The conference covered an exceptionally wide range of subjects, to follow Sugimoto's accomplishments in many fields. On the first day we had three talks on stellar evolution and six talks on stellar dynamics. On the second day, six talks on special-purpose computing and four talks on large-scale computing in Molecular Dynamics were given. On the third and the last day, three talks on dedicated computers on Lattice QCD calculations and six talks on present and future of general-purpose HPC systems were given.
