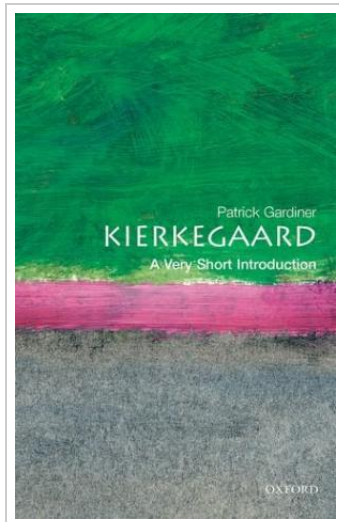




Kierkegaard: A Very Short Introduction
