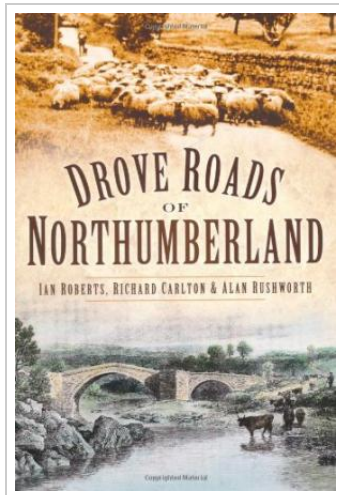




Drove Roads of Northumberland
