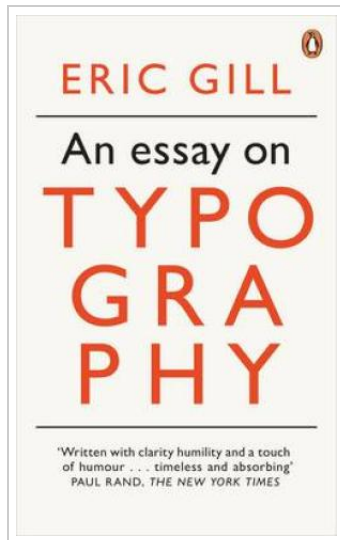




An Essay on Typography
