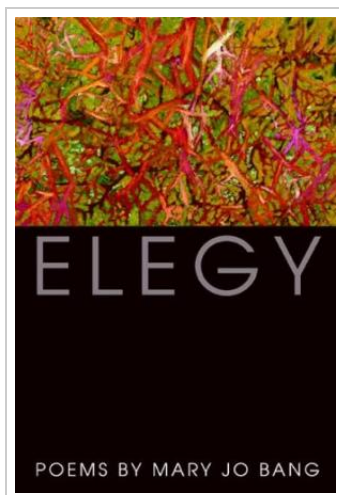




Elegy
