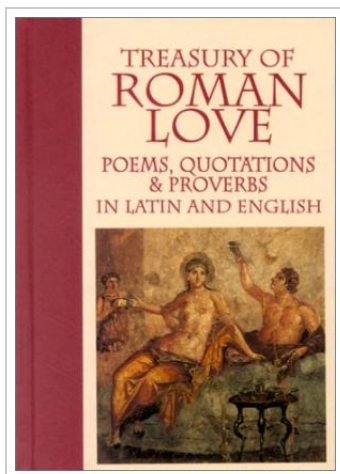




Treasury of Roman Love: Poems, Quotations & Proverbs in Latin and English
