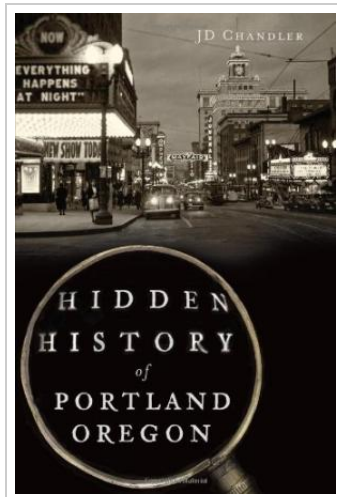




Hidden History of Portland, Oregon
