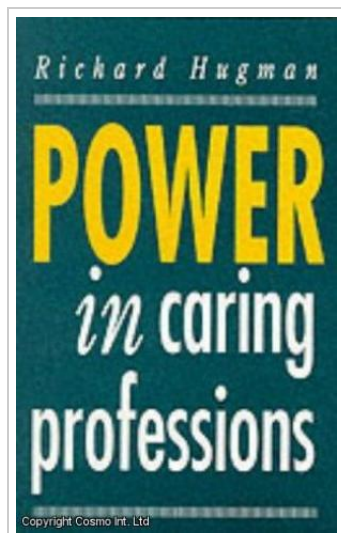




Power in Caring Professions
