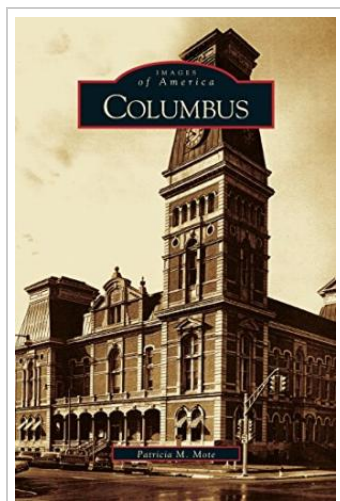




Columbus (Hardback)
