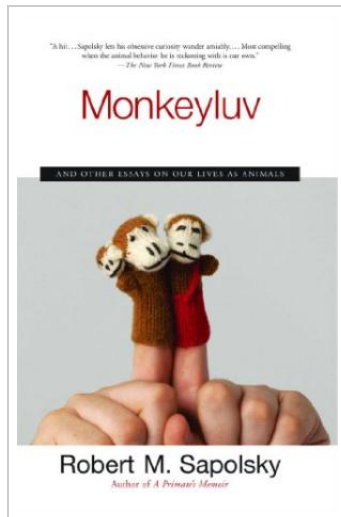




Monkeyluv: And Other Essays on Our Lives as Animals
