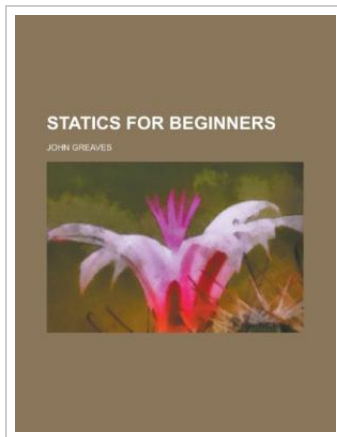

In the first system, which is sometimes described as that in which each pulley hangs by a separate string, the weight is attached to the lowest pulley: this is supported by a rope one end of which is attached to a fixed beam and the other end to the pulley next above, which is again supported in a similar way. The power is applied at the end of the rope supporting the highest pulley. The straight portions of the ropes are all vertical. Condition of equilibrium. (1) When the pulleys are supposed weightless.
