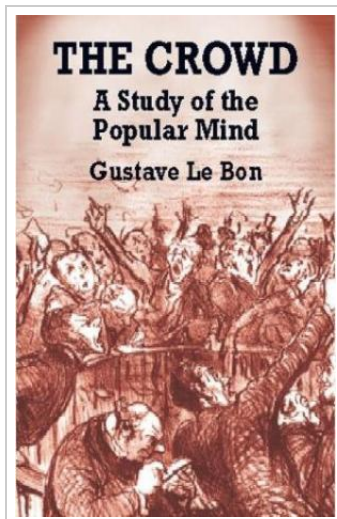




The Crowd (Paperback)
