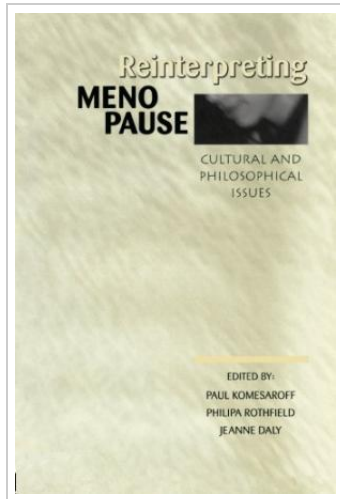




Reinterpreting Menopause: Cultural and Philosophical Issues
