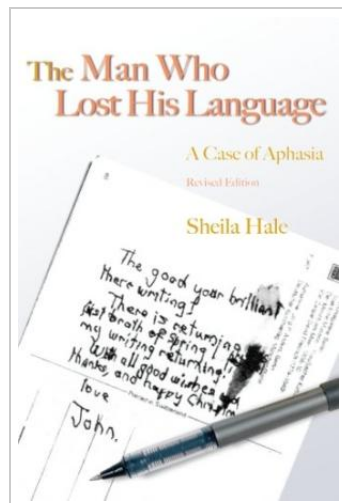




The Man Who Lost his Language: A Case of Aphasia Revised Edition (Paperback)
