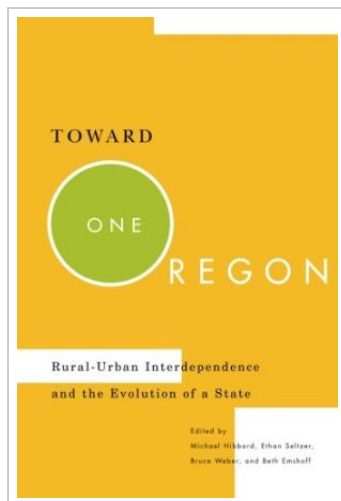




Toward One Oregon: Rural-Urban Interdependence and the Evolution of a State (Paperback)
