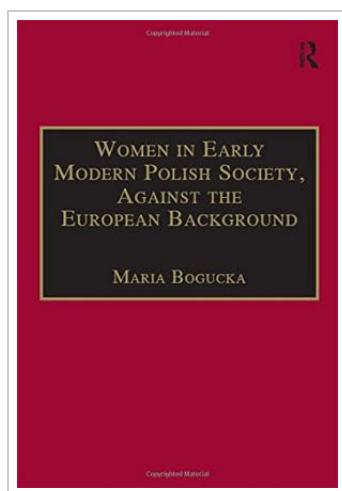




Women in Early Modern Polish Society, Against the European Background (Hardback)

While far fewer studies on women and gender have been published in Poland than in the West, the last decade has seen growing interest in gender history among Polish scholars. The first general history of Polish women in the early modern times was published by Dr. Bogucka in Polish in 1998; the present study constitutes an expansion, as well as a translation into English, of that seminal work. Women in Early Modern Polish Society, against the European Background makes widely available to historians and women s studies scholars in the West a mass of information about women in Poland from the 16th to the 18th century, previously inaccessible in Polish archives.
