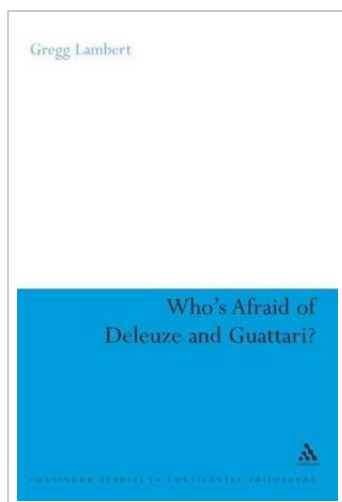




Who's Afraid of Deleuze and Guattari?
