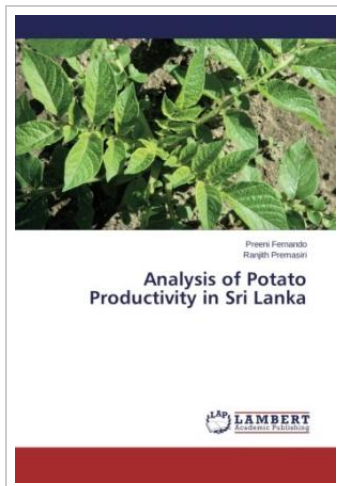




Analysis of Potato Productivity in Sri Lanka
