Excerpt: . . . or prescription drugs are the same, the authority to regulate dietary supplements, and to take action on safety concerns, is different from that for drugs. When FDA has health concerns about an over-the-counter ingredient, or combination of ingredients, the agency may determine that it is not generally recognized as safe and effective, and may issue a regulation or take other action to prohibit further marketing. FDA is not required to find that an over-the-counter drug is unsafe or dangerous to remove it from the market. In the case of dietary supplements, more significant safety concerns would have to be identified. For example, FDA is authorized to take regulatory action against a dietary supplement if its use would present a significant or unreasonable risk of illness under recommended conditions of use. If FDA were to take such action, however, it must be prepared to prove its allegations either in an administrative hearing or court. Unlike its regulation of over-the-counter...



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
