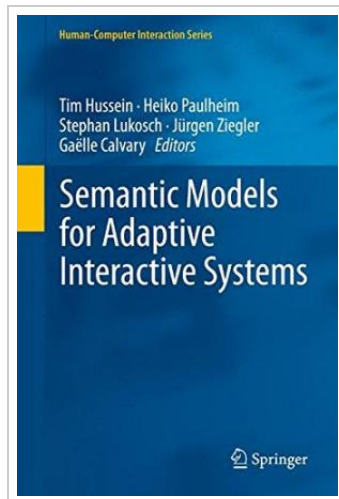




Semantic Models for Adaptive Interactive Systems
