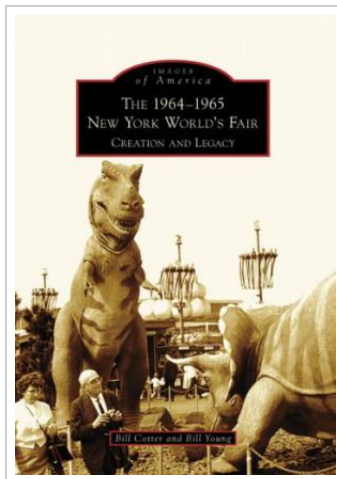




The 1964-1965 New York World's Fair: Creation and Legacy
