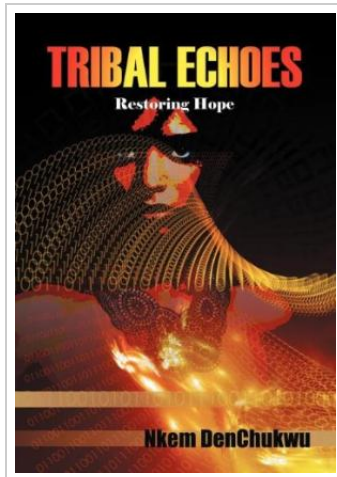




Tribal Echoes: Restoring Hope
