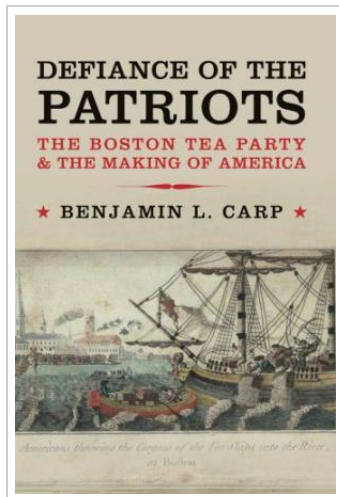




Defiance of the Patriots: The Boston Tea Party and the Making of America
