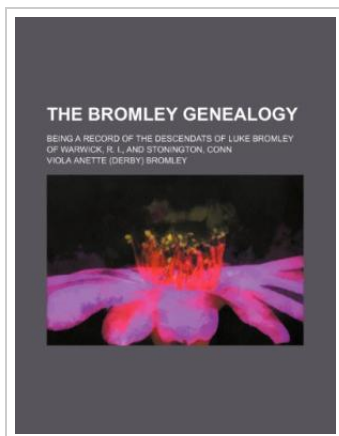




The Bromley Genealogy Being a Record of the Descendats of Luke Bromley of Warwick, R. I., and Stonington, Conn
