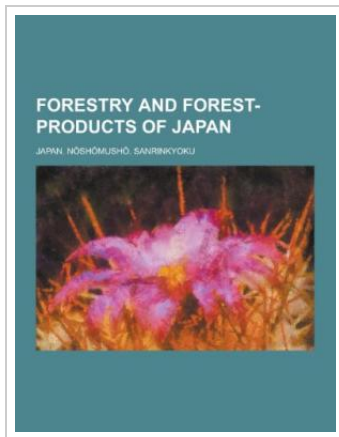

Excerpt: .planted at first, that is 4,0006,000 seedlings must have been planted per acre. After successive thinnings trees of 90-130 years were retained which form the last crop of the forest and which are most prized for making staves. These staves were taken from a tree 100 years old. Felling is effected from the beginning of May to the middle of June. The felled trees are peeled and are dried for half a year. The root end, to the length of 2 ft. and the branches are cut off. The trunks thus obtained, are sawn into lengths of Q ft. The Sap-wood is then removed on the four sides, the squared timber thus obtained gives four pieces of 1 chimare, from its outside whim sawn 2 inches thick. The remaining part which is heart-wood is then made into planks of 2 inches thick starting from...



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
