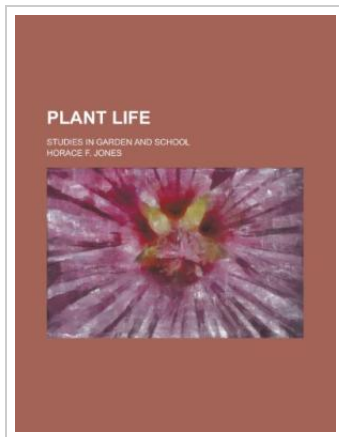




Plant Life Studies in Garden and School

The spikelets are smaller than those of the meadow fescue, and the glumes have short awns. This grass is chiefly found in dry, open situations. The Meadow Fescue (Fig. 42, 6), on the other hand, favours meadows and moist pastures, and occurs on banks and riversides. The leaves are flat, and the spikelets form a narrow and erect panicle. Vernal Grass (Fig. 42, 1). --A slender, erect grass, perennial in growth. The spikelets are one flowered, and form a spike-like panicle. A feature of the flower is the two stamens.
