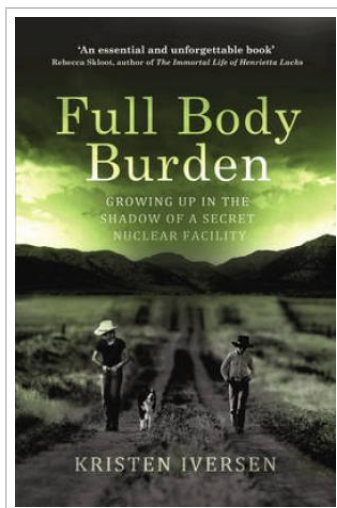




Full Body Burden
