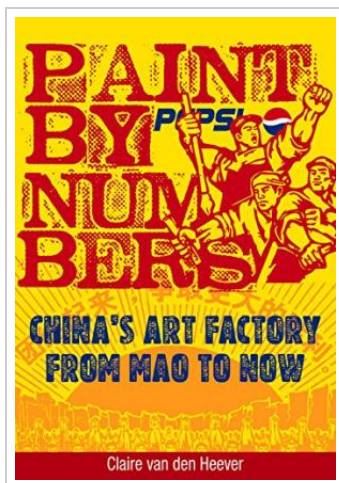




Paint by Numbers: China's Art Factory from Mao to Now (Paperback)
