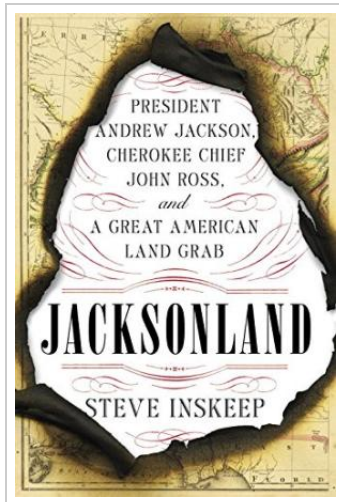




Jacksonland: President Andrew Jackson, Cherokee Chief John Ross, and a Great Ame
