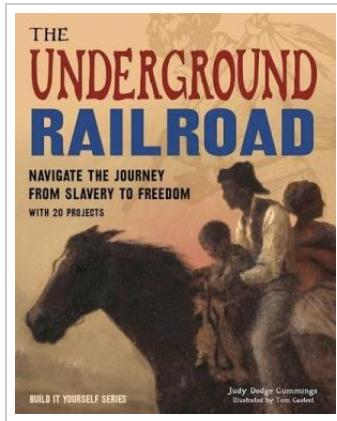




The Underground Railroad: Navigate the Journey from Slavery to Freedom (Build It Yourself)
