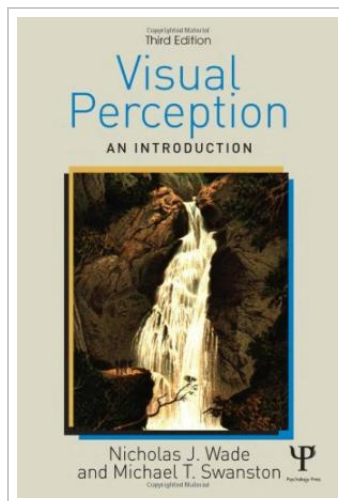




Visual Perception: An Introduction
