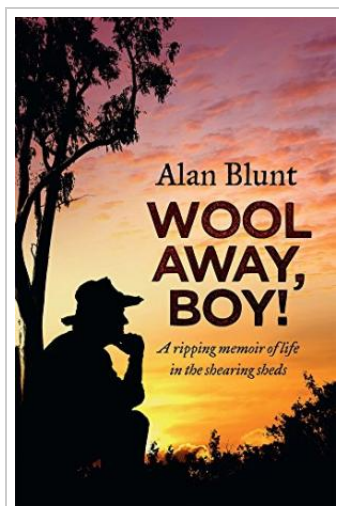




Wool Away, Boy!: A Ripping Memoir of Life in the Shearing Sheds
