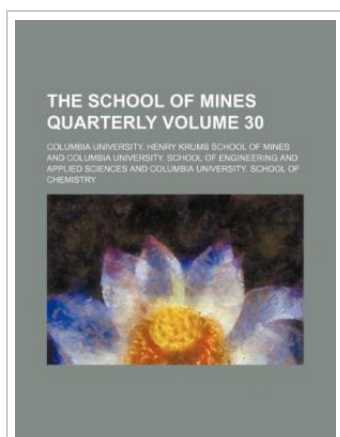

In the Beckmann rearrangement, the group which would exchange positions with the hydroxyl depends upon the nature of that group as compared with the nature of the nitrogen atom. The structural formulae considered so far have been assumed, as is general in organic chemistry, to be perfectly definite in any case, the linkings between the atoms, as determined by the reactions, decompositions and syntheses of the substances being fixed in position and not moving indiscriminately within the molecule.
